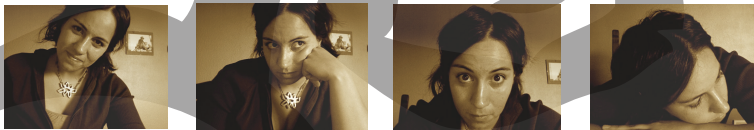


THE RESTORATION PROJECT, IN CONCERT (IN A HOUSE)
